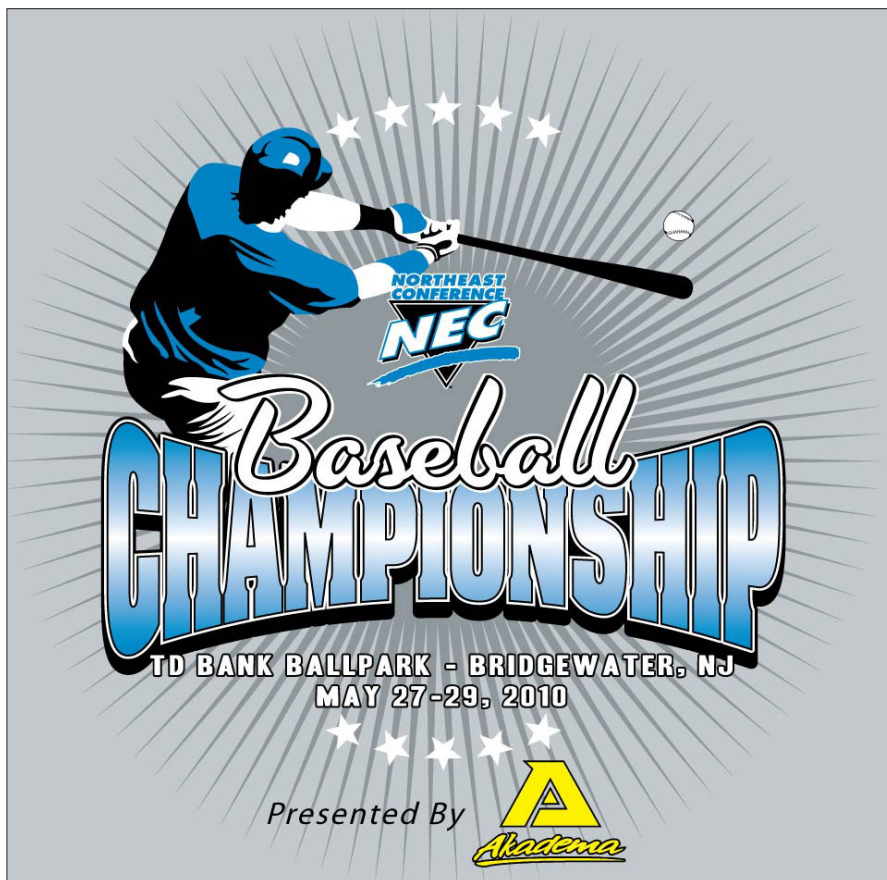

NEC Academic Honor Roll Student-Athletes

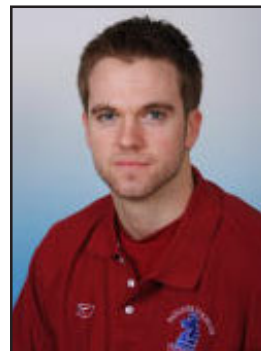


2008-09 NEC Baseball Scholar-Athlete of the Year:

Matt Maher, Fairleigh Dickinson

Major: Communications

Fairleigh Dickinson senior outfielder **Matt Maher (Peekskill, NY/JFK Catholic)** claimed the Scholar-Athlete award in baseball for the second straight season. Maher was named to the ESPN The Magazine/CoSIDA Academic All-America first team, a year after earning third team honors. This past season, the Peekskill, NY product was tabbed second team All-NEC and second team All-New Jersey Collegiate Baseball Association after hitting .339 with a team-high 45 runs scored. His 30 stolen bases ranked him first among Knights, second in the league and 19th in the nation. Maher concluded his career holding program records for hits (201), at-bats (651) and stolen bases (71). At the FDU Athletics Awards Banquet, he received the George Braun Alumni Leadership Award for his success on the diamond and in the classroom, as well as the Robert Metz Award, given to the male senior student-athlete sporting the highest cumulative grade point average upon graduation. An active member of the Communication Honor Society and intern in the Department of Athletic Communications, Maher also is a budding screenplay writer. He co-wrote the script and developed an original score for the film "Awake," which won the Campus Movie Festival's "Best Drama" category and advanced to the Northern Regional Finale at the Tribeca Grand Hotel Screening Room in New York City. Maher, a Communications major, sports a 3.95 grade point average.

During the next three days, four talented teams will compete in a double-elimination tournament with the winner receiving a coveted spot in the NCAA Division I Baseball Championship tournament.



Now in its 29th season, the NEC consists of 11 institutions of higher learning located throughout five states. The Conference is committed to providing opportunities for student-athletes to achieve their fullest potential both in athletic competition and in the classroom, as well as becoming an NCAA Division I leader for athletic success, academic achievement and integrity, sportsmanship, equity and diversity, community partnership and national engagement. NEC institutions span a number of diverse locations, from the urban bustle of Brooklyn, NY to the rural settings of Loretto, PA and Emmitsburg, MD, to the beaches and shoreline of West Long Branch, NJ. But when it comes to intercollegiate athletics, the goal of the NEC is consistent - to provide its members the opportunity to participate in quality competition at the Division I level while operating programs that are fully integrated in the academic mission of each institution. The NEC's commitment to academic excellence has translated into national recognition for both individual student-athletes and the league's member institutions as a whole. NEC student-athletes consistently graduate at well above the national average and its athletic programs continue to be honored for their Graduation Success Rate (GSR) and Academic Progress Rate (APR) figures. On a conference-wide level, more than 2,000 student-athletes qualified for the NEC Academic Honor Roll in 2008-09, nearly a 25 percent increase from the previous year. Saint Francis (PA) posted the highest GPA in the conference to claim the NEC Institutional Academic Award for the first time.

On the field of play, the NEC has enjoyed many successes both regionally and nationally, competing in 21 NCAA championships each year. The future of the NEC looks even brighter with new facilities and improvements recently completed, under construction or in planning stages at a majority of the league's member institutions.

We also would like to thank you, the fans, for your support and tremendous enthusiasm of the sport of baseball. Enjoy the action!

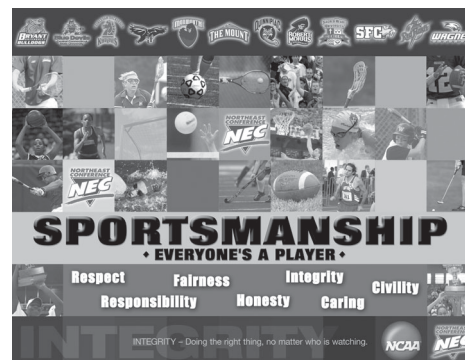

Message To Spectators
