2009-10 NEC Baseball Scholar-Athlete of the Year:

Jared Balbach, Sacred Heart

Major: Business

Only weeks after pitching Sacred Heart into the 2010 NEC Championship Game, senior **Jared Balbach (Pine Bush, NY/Pine Bush)** captured the baseball Scholar-Athlete award. The veteran left-hander compiled a 9-3 record last season while sporting a 3.63 earned-run average that was fourth amongst league leaders. Balbach produced seven complete-game efforts in 14 starts on the way to logging the third-most innings (91.2) in the conference last season. Following his selection to the 2010 All-NEC First Team, Balbach continued his winning ways in the postseason. The senior southpaw went the distance, tossing 141 pitches, to notch an 8-3 victory over eventual-league champion Central Connecticut State at the 2010 NEC Tournament. Pitching best during the season's stretch run, Balbach went 4-0 with a 1.85 ERA in his last six starts. Studying business, Balbach accounted for a 3.77 grade-point average.

But when it comes to intercollegiate athletics, the goal of the NEC is consistent - to provide its members the opportunity to participate in quality competition at the Division I level while operating programs that are fully integrated in the academic mission of each institution. The NEC's commitment to academic excellence has translated into national recognition for both individual student-athletes and the league's member institutions as a whole. NEC student-athletes consistently graduate at well above the national average and its athletic programs continue to be honored for their Graduation Success Rate (GSR) and Academic Progress Rate (APR) figures. On a conference-wide level, more than 2,200 student-athletes qualified for the NEC Academic Honor Roll in 2009-10, a 13 percent increase from the previous year. Fairleigh Dickinson and Saint Francis (PA) posted the highest overall GPAs in the conference to share the NEC Institutional Academic Award.

On the field of play, the NEC has enjoyed many successes both regionally and nationally, competing in 23 NCAA championships each year. The future of the NEC looks even brighter with new facilities and improvements recently completed, under construction or in planning stages at a majority of the league's member institutions.

We also would like to thank you, the fans, for your support and tremendous enthusiasm of the sport of baseball. Enjoy the action!

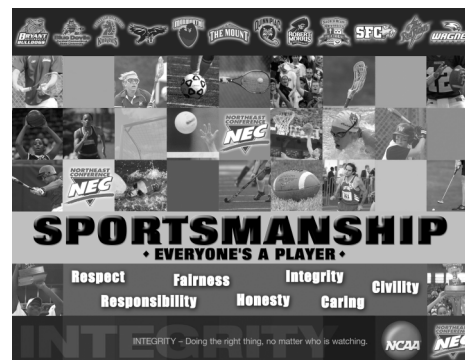

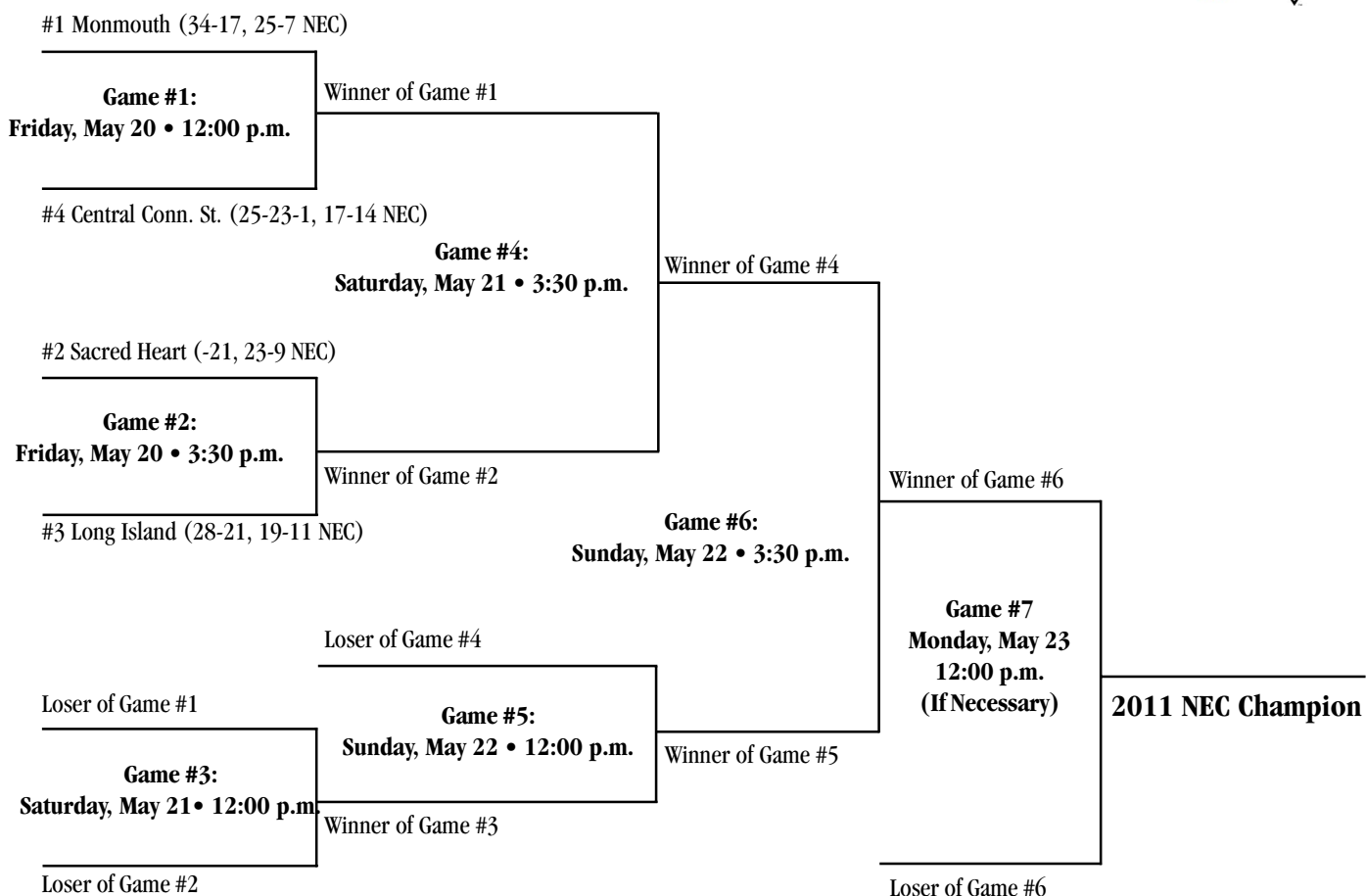
