Saint Francis (PA) and Fairleigh Dickinson Share 2009-10 NEC Institutional Academic Award Team GPA Award Winners Also Announced

Somerset, NJ -- Saint Francis (PA) University student-athletes had no trouble maintaining the academic success that earned their department the 2008-09 Northeast Conference (NEC) Institutional Academic Award, but this year the Red Flash have company. With their student-athletes accounting for identical 3.239 combined grade-point averages, Saint Francis (PA) and Fairleigh Dickinson University share the NEC honor for the 2009-10 academic year.

"Saint Francis is honored and humbled to have earned the Northeast Conference Institutional Academic Award for the second consecutive year. This award is a tribute to the commitment of our student athletes, our coaches, and the Saint Francis faculty," said Bob Krimmel, Saint Francis' Director of Athletics. "Saint Francis congratulates the co-recipient, Fairleigh Dickinson, and all of our conference institutions for continuing to emphasize the academic component of the student athlete experience. The Northeast Conference represents the best in NCAA Division I athletics through our commitment to academics, as this reflects a vital aspect of the mission of our conference."

Fairleigh Dickinson's Director of Athletics David Langford expressed similar words.

"We're very excited. We are always very proud of our student-athletes and coaches for understanding that our No. 1 goal is academic success. Being tied with Saint Francis for highest GPA in the NEC makes this a banner year in that regard. It reinforces our values and we are very proud."

The award is presented annually to the NEC member who attains the highest overall institutional grade-point average amongst student-athletes competing in sports sponsored by the NCAA Division I conference. The NEC currently sponsors a total of 22 sports: baseball, men's and women's basketball, women's bowling, men's and women's cross country, football, field hockey, men's and women's golf, women's lacrosse, men's and women's indoor and outdoor track and field, men's and women's soccer, softball, women's swimming, men's and women's tennis and women's volleyball.

After winning its first Institutional Academic Award by virtue of a 3.234 GPA last year, Saint Francis used a slight boost to earn the honor once again. Sixteen of the 20 athletic teams at Saint Francis attained a GPA in excess of 3.0. Fairleigh Dickinson improved its combined grade-point average by 0.2 to stake co-ownership of the 2009-10 Award. The Knights saw 15 of their 18 teams account for at least a 3.0 GPA.

Overall, the NEC's 4,300+ student-athletes averaged a 3.135 GPA for the 2009-10 year, an increase from 3.120 in 2008-09. Ten of the NEC's 12 core member institutions finished the year with at least a 3.0 GPA.

The conference also recognized the teams who compiled the best GPA in their respective sports. The Central Connecticut State women's volleyball team recorded a 3.720 grade point average for the year, the highest in any NEC sponsored sport. Fairleigh Dickinson women's golf, which accounted for a 3.706 GPA, was a close second.

Robert Morris and Wagner claimed an NEC-best four team GPA awards, followed by three apiece for Fairleigh Dickinson, Quinnipiac, and Saint Francis (PA). Monmouth was also multiple sport winner with two.
