Sacred Heart Leads After First Round Of NEC Men's Golf Championship Salah, Mercatoris Hold One-Stroke Lead

Daytona Beach, FL - Sacred Heart posted a promising start to the 2011 Northeast Conference Men's Golf Championship, ending day one with a 295. The Pioneers' team score was just seven strokes over the par-72, 6,937-yard International Course at ChampionsGate Golf Club. It also bested the tournament-low from last year (300) by five strokes. Robert Morris finished round one two strokes behind the Sacred Heart squad in second with a nine-over 297. Slightly off the leaders' pace was Mount St. Mary's and Monmouth in a tie for third, carding tallies of 305. Identical marks were also turned in by Long Island, defending champion Saint Francis (PA) and Central Connecticut State as trio squeezed in the fifth slot, just a stroke above third (306). Wagner and Fairleigh Dickinson almost shared the same spot, but the Seahawks claimed a one-stroke advantage (314) over the Knights (315) to notch eighth, putting FDU in ninth. St. Francis (NY) concluded the field of 10 with a 339 after day one. Bryant competed as individuals and did not record a team score, as they are still in the reclassifying process and ineligible for the NCAA's automatic bid into regional play.

Leading Sacred Heart's campaign for a third championship title in four years is sophomore **Joshua Salah** (**Gloucester**, **MA/Gloucester**). Salah, who took home fifth last season, fired frames of 34-37 to book a one-under 71 and a piece of first place. Also in the top slot is Robert Morris' **C.G. Mercatoris** (**Brookville**, **PA/Brookville**), who carded the opposite of Salah with a 37-34. The Colonial senior nabbed second place in 2010. Capping the top-three after the first 18 holes was Long Island's **Rocky Co** (**Richmond Hill, Ontario/St. Robert**). Co, who knocked in an even-par 72, came down the back nine hitting a 35 to balance his first-nine total of 37.

Five golfers are bunched in the fourth-place position at one-over par. Shooting a 73 was Mount St. Mary's **Devin O'Grady (Lancaster, PA/Manheim Township)**, Sacred Heart's **Leo Garcia (Guaynabo, Puerto Rico/Colegio Marista)**, Robert Morris' **Brock Pompeani (Aliquippa, PA/Hopewell)**, Monmouth's **Greg Etimos (East Islip, NY/East Islip)** and Saint Francis' (PA) **Michael Magalski (Spring Grove, PA/Spring Grove)**.

Shoring up ninth place was **Kyle Hoffman (Pawtucket, RI/Bishop Feehan)** and **Ray Hyre (Bowie, MD/Bowie)**. The duo boasted matching scores of 74, only three strokes off first place. Bryant's Hoffmann shot a 38-36, including an eagle at hole-18, while Mount St. Mary's Hyre fired a 40-34.

The second round of the 2011 NEC Men's Golf Championship is scheduled for Saturday, April 30, beginning with a shotgun start at 7:30 a.m. The final round is slated for Sunday, May 1.
