


2009-10 NEC Men's Lacrosse Scholar-Athlete of the Year:

Timmy Katz, Sacred Heart

Major: Business

Sacred Heart senior Timmy Katz (Freeport, NY/Freeport), winner of the men's lacrosse Scholar-Athlete award, had quite a senior season. En-route to earning all-NEC first team honors, Katz tallied a career-high 32 goals and led the Pioneers in scoring for a third consecutive season. He totaled 116 points (78 G, 38 A) in 53 career games at Sacred Heart. Two different organizations (NEILA and USILA) named the veteran attacker to their All-Star Game. Katz recorded two goals and an assist in the USILA North-South All-Star Game before becoming the second player in Sacred Heart history to be selected in the Major League Lacrosse Draft. The fifth-round choice of his hometown Long Island Lizards, Katz was the 28th player overall selected in the draft. The Business major posted a 3.28 grade-point average and was named both a USILA Scholar All-American and a NEILA Scholar-Athlete.

Celebrating its 30th anniversary, the NEC looks forward to the men's lacrosse championship here at Mount St. Mary's University. We hope it is a memorable experience for fans and student-athletes alike. During the next three days, nearly 200 talented players on four different teams will compete in a single-elimination tournament. By Sunday evening, we will know who will make history to capture the first-ever Northeast Conference men's lacrosse title.

Consisting of 12 institutions of higher learning located throughout six states, the NEC is committed to providing opportunities for student-athletes to achieve their fullest potential both in athletic competition and in the classroom, as well as becoming an NCAA Division I leader for athletic success, academic achievement and integrity, sportsmanship, equity and diversity, community partnership and national engagement. NEC member institutions include Central Connecticut State, Fairleigh Dickinson, Long Island, Monmouth, Mount St. Mary's, Quinnipiac, Robert Morris, Sacred Heart, St. Francis (NY), Saint Francis (PA) and Wagner. Bryant University will become a core member of the NEC in 2012 upon completion of the five-year NCAA Division I reclassification period.



NEC institutions span a number of diverse locations, from the urban bustle of Brooklyn, NY to the rural settings of Loretto, PA and Emmitsburg, MD, to the beaches and shoreline of West Long Branch, NJ. But when it comes to intercollegiate athletics, the goal of the NEC is consistent - to provide its members the opportunity to participate in quality competition at the Division I level while operating programs that are fully integrated in the academic mission of each institution. The NEC's commitment to academic excellence has translated into national recognition for both individual student-athletes and the league's member institutions as a whole. NEC student-athletes consistently graduate at well above the national average and its athletic programs continue to be honored for their Graduation Success Rate (GSR) and Academic Progress Rate (APR) figures. On a conference-wide level, more than 2,200 student-athletes qualified for the NEC Academic Honor Roll in 2009-10, a 13 percent increase from the previous year. Fairleigh Dickinson and Saint Francis (PA) posted the highest overall GPAs in the conference to share the NEC Institutional Academic Award.

On the field of play, the NEC has enjoyed many successes both regionally and nationally, competing in 23 NCAA championships each year. The future of the NEC looks even brighter with new facilities and improvements recently completed, under construction or in planning stages at a majority of the league's member institutions.

We also would like to thank you, the fans, for your support and tremendous enthusiasm of the sport of lacrosse. Enjoy the action!




