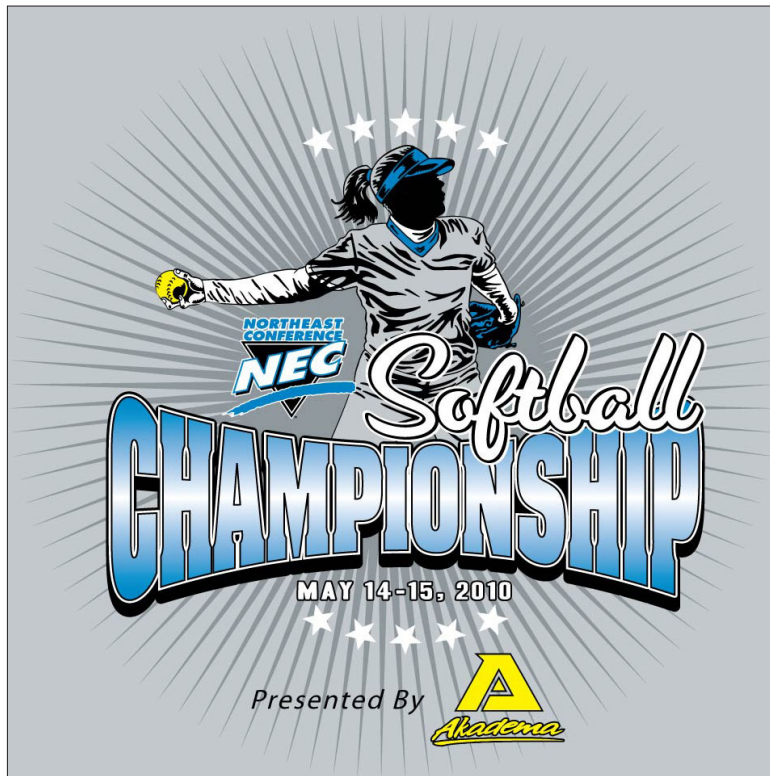

NEC Academic Honor Roll Student-Athletes



2005-06 NEC Women's Softball Scholar Athlete of the Year:

Andrea Lazzari, Wagner

Major: Sociology and Education

Wagner senior first baseman **Andrea Lazzari (Reno, NV/Wooster)** collected the Scholar-Athlete prize in softball, the latest in a string of honors for the Reno, NV product. In addition to back-to-back NEC Player of the Year awards, Lazzari was named Wagner's Student-Athlete of the Year and was honored as an ESPN The Magazine/CoSIDA First Team Academic All-American. In 2009, she won the NEC Triple Crown with a .412 average, league record 16 homers and 51 RBI. Lazzari also established single-season school marks with 70 hits and 338 putouts, and leaves Wagner as the career recordholder in home runs (34), doubles (50), hits (238), total bases (390) and putouts (1,124). A former NEC Rookie of the Year and three-time first team All-NEC pick, she was named to the Louisville Slugger/NFCA Division I All-Region first team at year's end. Lazzari carried a 3.83 grade point average with a double major of Sociology and Education.

By Satday evening, we will know who has claimed the 2010 title in the Northeast Conference Softball Championship.



Now in its 29th season, the NEC consists of 11 institutions of higher learning located throughout five states. The Conference is committed to providing opportunities for student-athletes to achieve their fullest potential both in athletic competition and in the classroom, as well as becoming an NCAA Division I leader for athletic success, academic achievement and integrity, sportsmanship, equity and diversity, community partnership and national engagement. Bryant University will become a core member of the NEC in 2012 upon completion of the five-year NCAA Division I reclassification period.

NEC institutions span a number of diverse locations, from the urban bustle of Brooklyn, NY to the rural settings of Loretto, PA and Emmitsburg, MD, to the beaches and shoreline of West Long Branch, NJ. But when it comes to intercollegiate athletics, the goal of the NEC is consistent - to provide its members the opportunity to participate in quality competition at the Division I level while operating programs that are fully integrated in the academic mission of each institution. The NEC's commitment to academic excellence has translated into national recognition for both individual student-athletes and the league's member institutions as a whole. NEC student-athletes consistently graduate at well above the national average and its athletic programs continue to be honored for their Graduation Success Rate (GSR) and Academic Progress Rate (APR) figures. On a conference-wide level, more than 2,000 student-athletes qualified for the NEC Academic Honor Roll in 2008-09, nearly a 25 percent increase from the previous year. Saint Francis (PA) posted the highest GPA in the conference to claim the NEC Institutional Academic Award for the first time.

On the field of play, the NEC has enjoyed many successes both regionally and nationally, competing in 21 NCAA championships each year. The future of the NEC looks even brighter with new facilities and improvements recently completed, under construction or in planning stages at a majority of the league's member institutions.

We also would like to thank you, the fans, for your support and tremendous enthusiasm of the sport of softball. Enjoy the action!

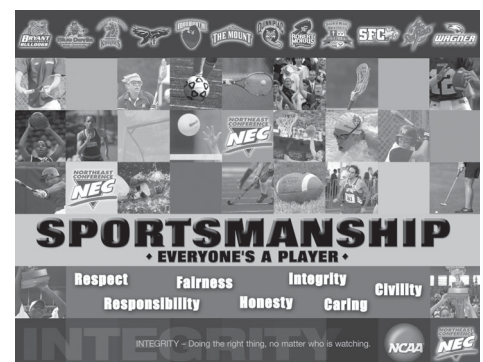

Message To Spectators

Northeast Conference member institutions value the principles of sportsmanship and the ideal of pursuing victory with honor in intercollegiate athletics. The Conference believes that athletics should be conducted in a way that reflects positively on the individual participants and institutions. 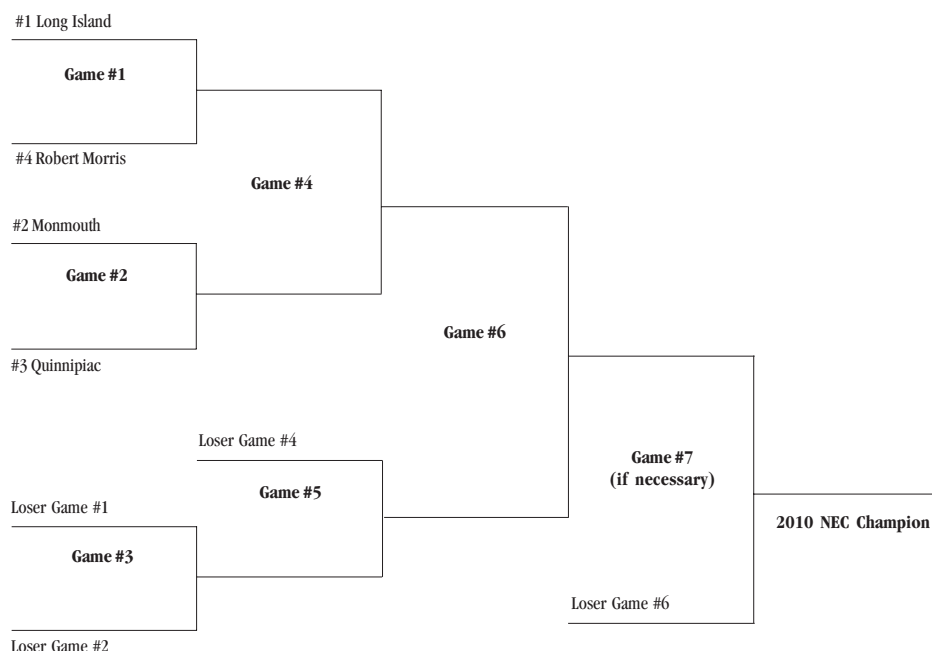

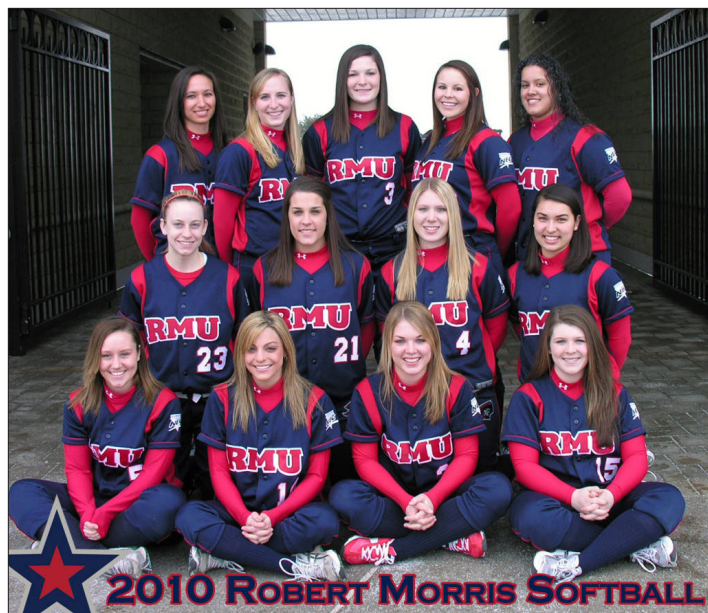
